DAY 106

LESSONS COVERED: ULAT 2.18, 2.19

CONTENT:

1. PRESENT PROGRESSIVE TENSE OR AN EXPRESSION CONVEYING ITS EQUIVALENT SENSE

OVERVIEW: In lesson 2.19, the students will be presented with the distinction between actions that habitually take place and those that are taking place right now. In English, this distinction would correspond to the difference between the simple present and the present progressive tenses. Depending on which language you are teaching, you may have to teach your students an entirely new verb tense or merely an expression to emphasize what is currently happening.

ACTIVITIES:

- 1. Evaluate your students as they give their oral 2-minute weekly routine presentation. Use the **ORAL PRESENTATION EVALUATION GUIDE** to evaluate their talk.
