LESSONS COVERED: ULAT 2.20

CONTENT:

1. PRESENT PROGRESSIVE TENSE OR AN EXPRESSION
CONVEYING ITS EQUIVALENT SENSE

OVERVIEW: Lesson 2.20 presents the students with the conjugations of verbs used in forming the present progressive tense or in combination with expressions conveying a progressive meaning. The conjugation section is accompanied by four short videos intended to illustrate further the meaning of this structure. As this lesson is very long, it is broken up into two parts to be studied on consecutive class periods.

ACTIVITIES:

1. Begin class by performing a **WALK AROUND** with the students. Ask them questions in the simple present regarding the teachers, staff members and students you see on your walk and then ask them about what those individuals are doing at this very moment to highlight the difference between the simple present and the present progressive.
2. **READ** through sections 6, 8 and 10 with the students.
3. Give the students time to do **INDEPENDENT STUDY** of sections 7, 9 and 11.
4. Perform an **ORAL PARTICIPATION** session on sections 7, 9 and 11.
