LESSONS COVERED: UNIT 2 TEST - PART 1

CONTENT:

1. LISTENING COMPREHENSION

OVERVIEW: The ULAT breaks up the six parts of the Unit 1 Test into six separate days, assuming that most teachers must test at least 20 students, one at a time, within a typical class period of less than an hour in length. However, students in smaller or longer classes could possibly take more than one part of the test per day, as could those in which the instructor has an assistant who is competent to perform the evaluation of a second student simultaneously.

In Part 1 of the test, teachers click on the symbol of the mouse found at the top, prior to the first form of the test. They should allow their students to take notes over the contents of the recording and the recording should be played twice in its entirety. The students will hear a person describing his life and then are presented with a series of ten questions about that person to which they are to respond orally in a complete sentence when called individually to come forward for evaluation. (See the grading key by clicking on the percent symbol found at the upper right of the page containing the test.)

After having been tested, the students are to turn immediately to their preparation for part 2 of the test, that will deal with responding to questions about their own life.

- **4. PRACTICE THE TEST** found in part 2 of the Unit 2 Test.
